Self-Advocate Volunteer Must Haves:

- At least 18 years' old
- Be living with a disability (including mental health diagnoses)
- Have or have done work in the disability community as a self-advocate or peer-advocate to others who have a disability
- Interested in raising disability awareness in the sexual violence field

Self-Advocate Volunteer Activities May Include:

- Being a member of the Advocates for Survivor Accessibility Advisory
 Group or A.S.A. Group
- Helping 'Services for Women with Disabilities Coordinator or SWDC' make plans to do outreach to the disability community
- Helping SWDC plan meetings for the A.S.A. Group
- Helping SWDC make programming for other survivors who have a disability to use in a group
- Be a co-group leader with *SWDC* during groups with survivors who have a disability
- Help plan meetings with police officers, county attorney offices, domestic violence program staff, sexual violence program staff, and others to talk about issues survivors with disabilities face when they ask for help
